Introduction to LWARB

- A public body
- Chaired by the Mayor of London or his representative
- Current Chair Dr Liz Goodwin
- Partnership between London's municipalities (33) and the Mayor of London
- LWARB have to 'Act in Accordance' with the Mayor's waste policies

The Mayor of London has made the transition to a low carbon circular economy one of the central strategic approaches of his London Environment Strategy.

The Mayor is taking a circular approach to London's use of resources through:

- significantly cutting waste
- a focus on maximising the recycling of materials that are left
- generating low carbon energy from truly residual waste leaving very little waste going to landfill and;
- ensuring that there is sufficient infrastructure to support these actions within London helping to create opportunities for businesses developing reuse, repair and remanufacturing services

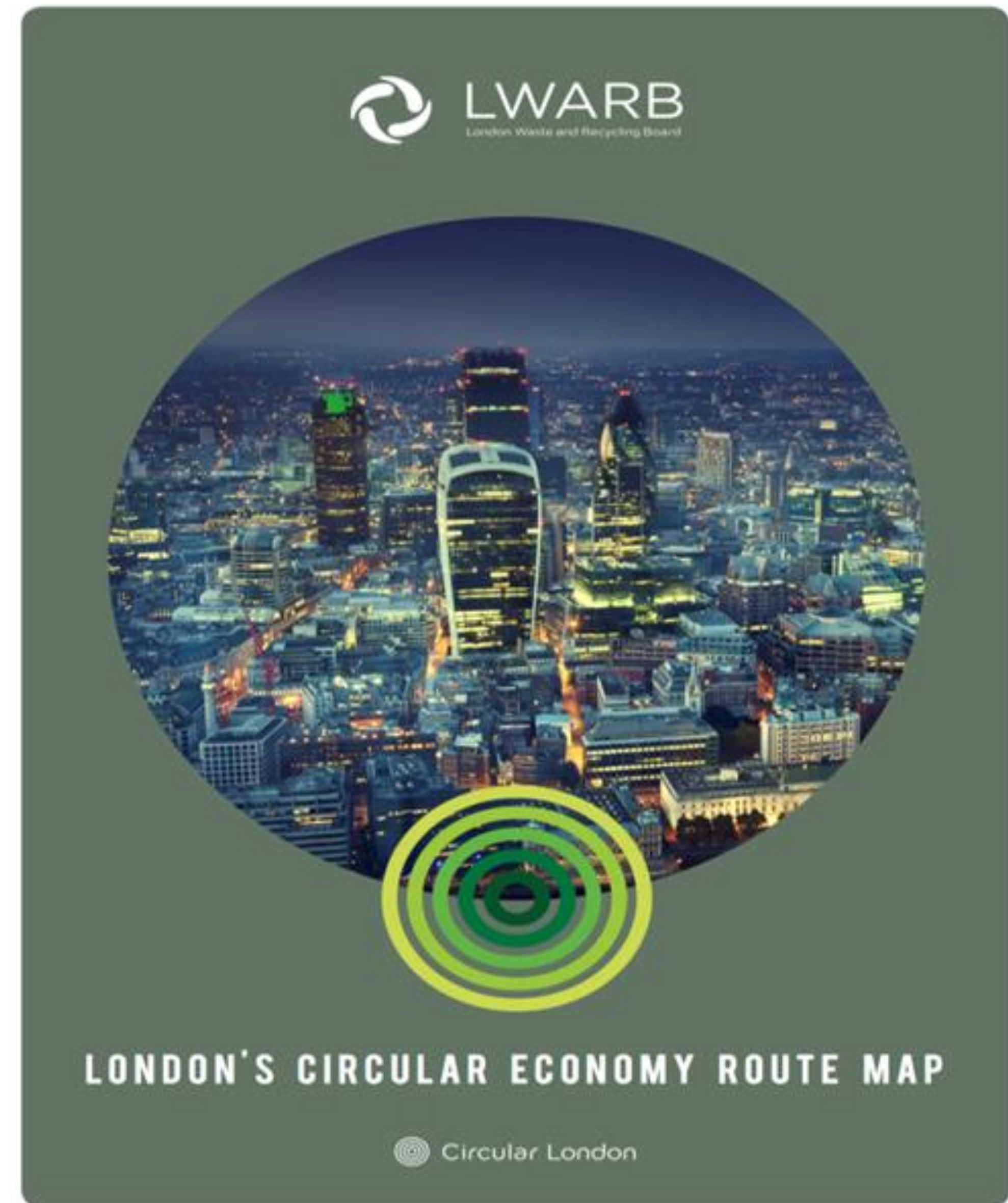

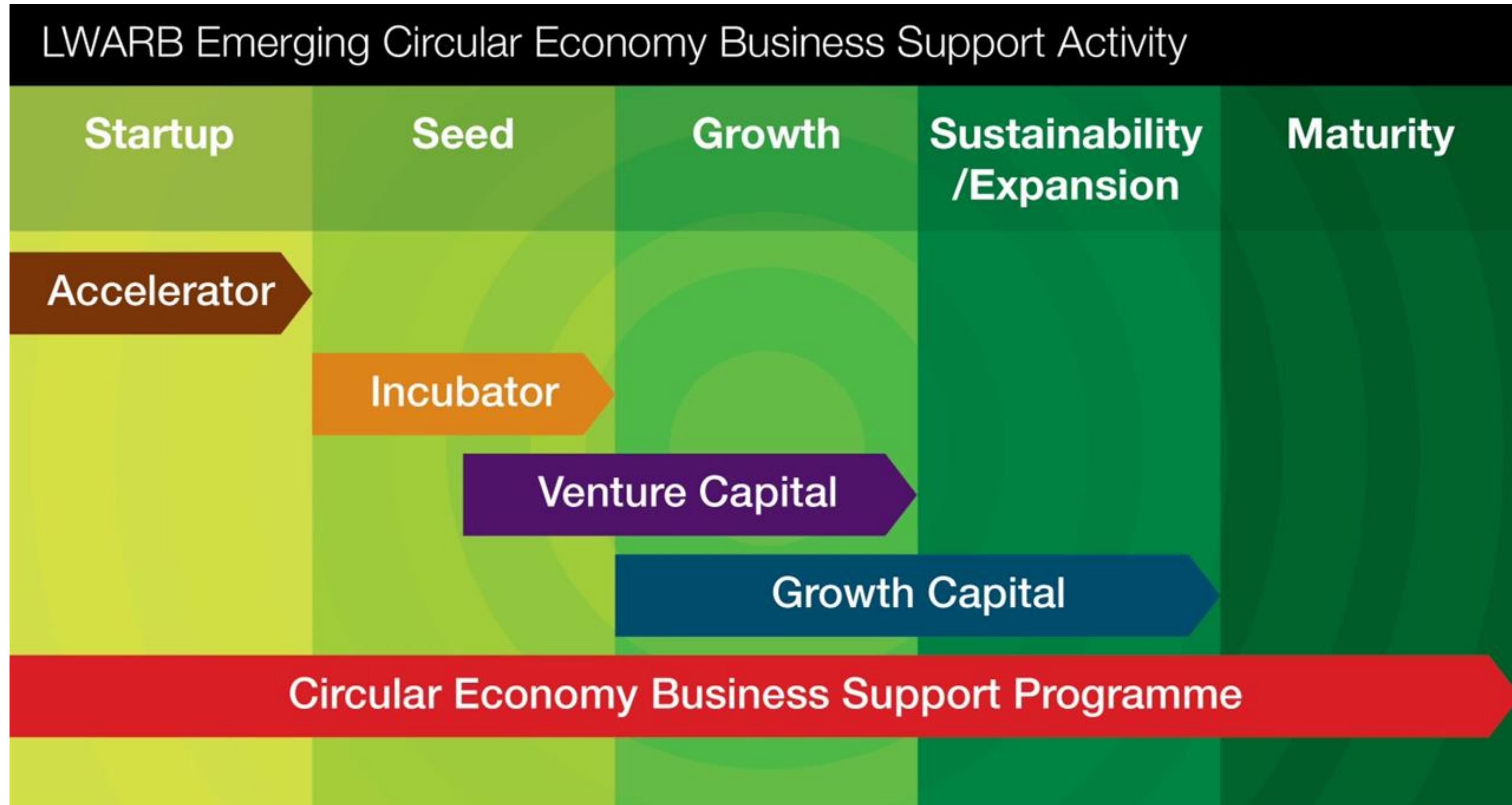

LWARB have identified a £7 billion circular economy opportunity in London.

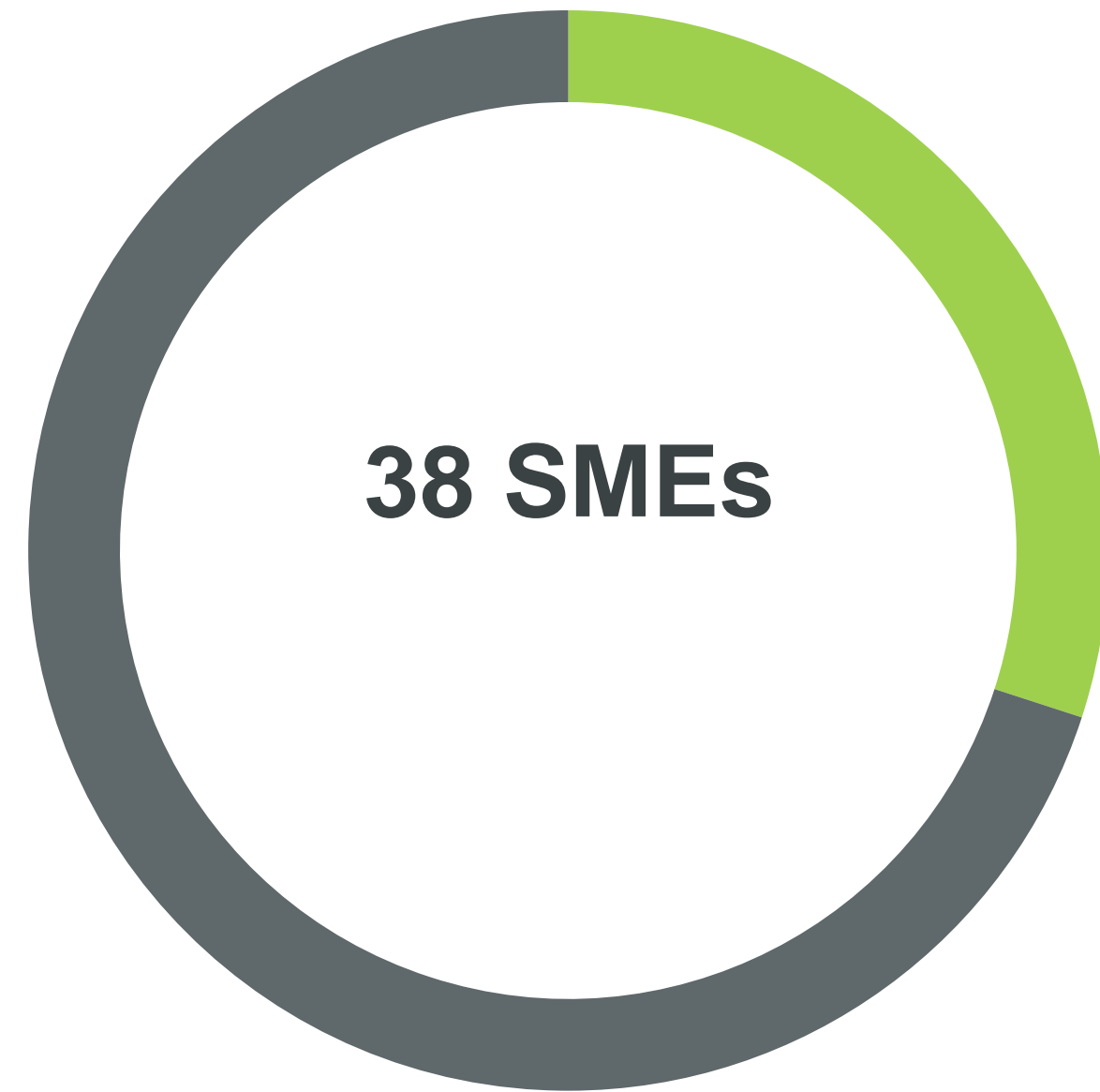




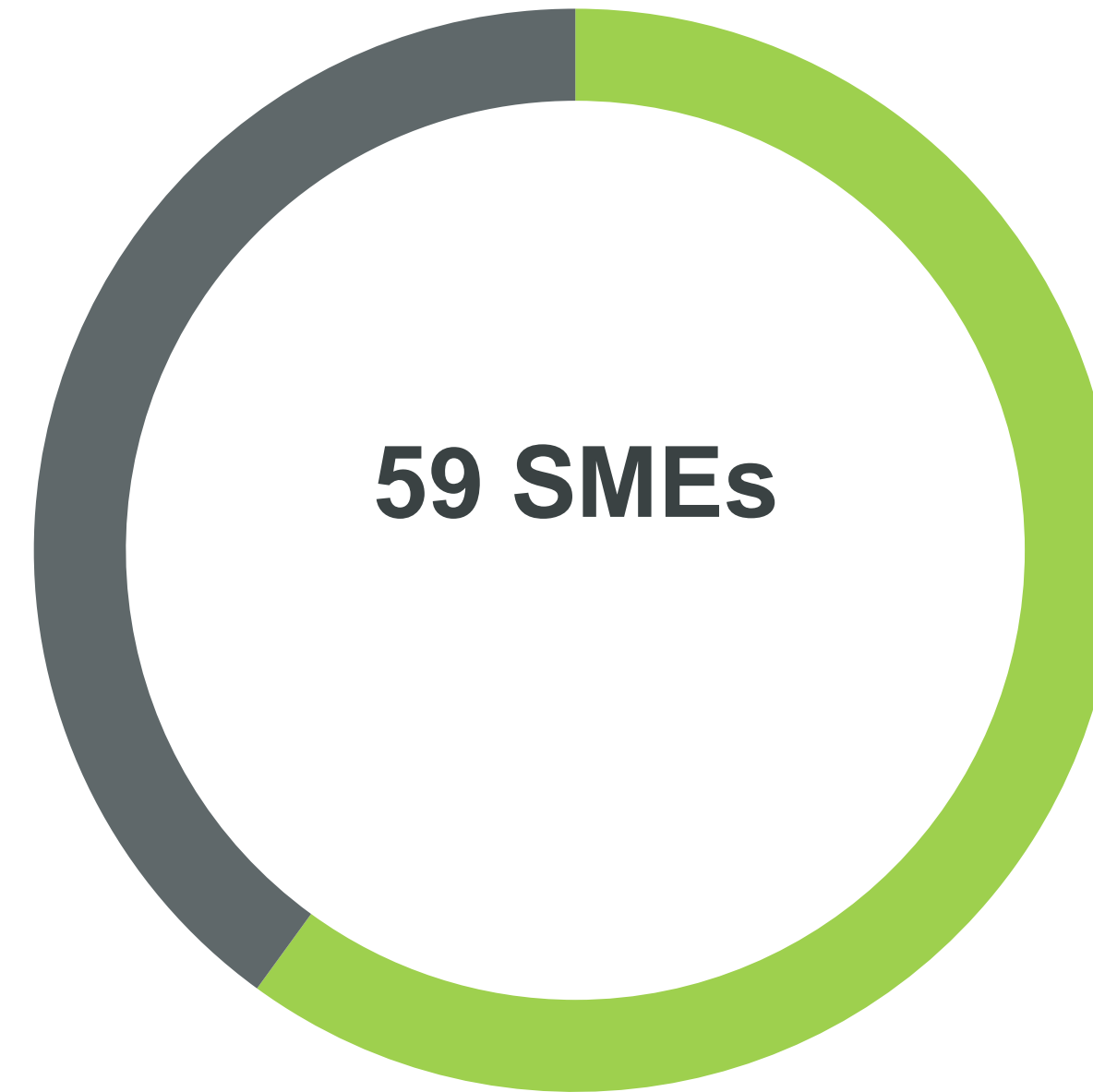
Advance London
